Bingo Big in Brazil
Bingo, which has had a turbulent legal history in Brazil, is on the verge of a legitimate comeback. While the game was banned in the early 2000s due to concerns over money laundering and illegal gambling, a legislative shift is currently on the table. Having passed the approval of the Senate in 2024, dedicated new bills are expected to reintroduce bingo halls under a more regulated framework. This would provide significant opportunities for both local and international investors. Brazilian Senate projections envision 1.5 million direct and indirect jobs and potential annual revenues of R\$22bn, benefitting states, municipalities and the central government. Indeed, recent legislative changes are reaching further. After fine-tuning the sports betting and online casino rules in 2024, industry stakeholders expect a comprehensive framework for lotteries, bingo and land-based casino facilities. This regulatory evolution is part of a broader effort to modernize Brazil's

gambling sector, moving it away from state monopolies.

Furbaby Bingo a Hit
There are many reasons to attend the annual Furbaby Bingo event in Goldsboro, North Carolina—from the fun to the stellar prizes, but it is also an important fundraiser for the Animal Welfare League of Wayne County to help improve the lives of companion animals around Wayne County. The fundraiser was first held in 2024 and raised \$2,000, according to Donna Archer, board secretary. "It may not sound like a lot, but that money is very important. We used the money to start a spay, neuter voucher program, and we had 44 spayed. We gave \$500 to the shelter for food around Christmas time," Donna says. When Hurricane Helene hit, they took a big hit in donations. But despite that they went to work gathering donations of pet food—a collection drive that turned so big that the YMCA partnered with them. They

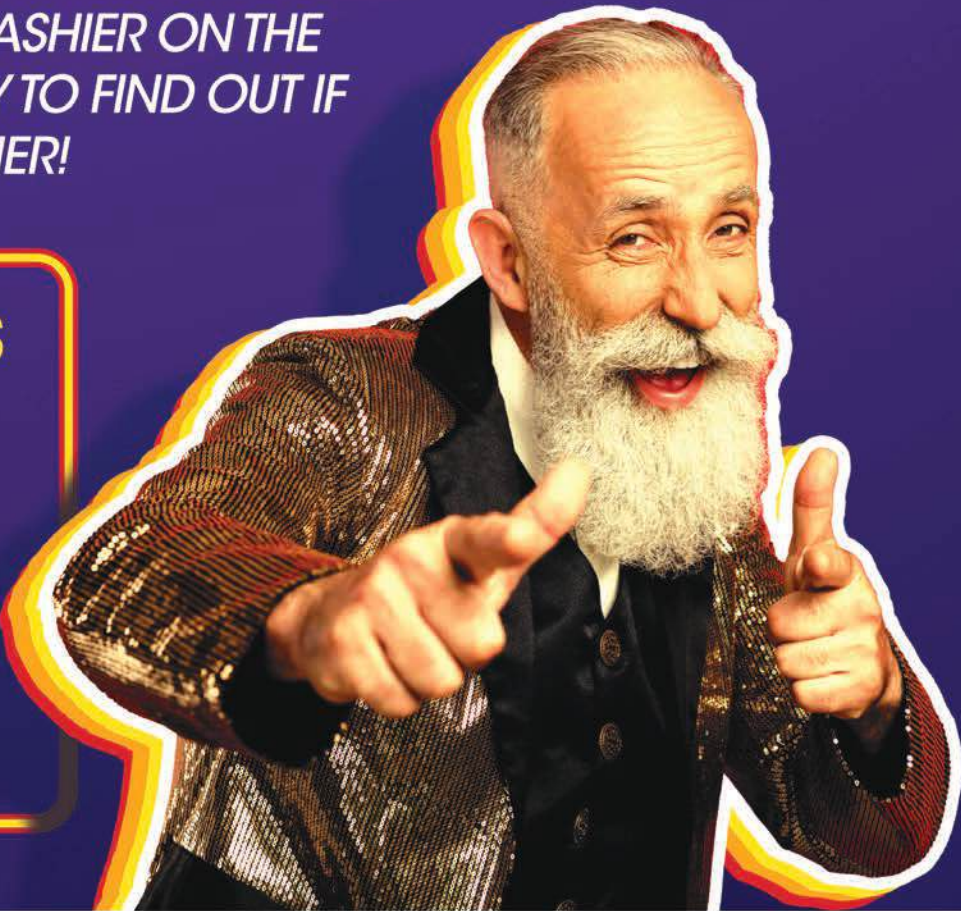

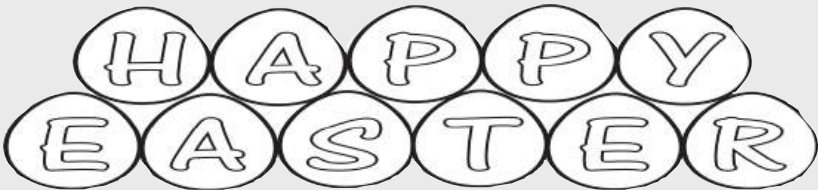

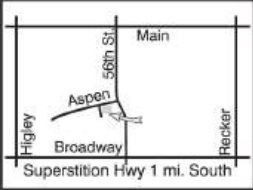

Buzzing at Bingo

Hi Guy,

We are having a problem with cell-phone users at Bingo. People are lowering the volume somewhat but are not turning their cell phones off, so all night you hear little chirps and beeps and songs. Others turn their phones to “vibrate” so that you do not hear them ring, but they rattle on the table—which is equally noisy and distracting.

Don’t you think there should be a rule for Bingo halls that is the same for movie theaters—where people are required to shut off their cell phones during the movie so as not to disturb the other patrons?

—Stephen, Massachusetts, via email

Hi Stephen,

Shutting off cell phones in movie theaters is not so much a rule as it is a courtesy—the theater operators ask that people turn them off, but patrons who choose not to do so are not breaking any laws; they’re just being jerks.

Lots of Bingo halls require that people shut off their cell phones before Bingo begins. Often, they will make an announcement before the start of Bingo, much like movie theaters do.

Because Bingo halls are licensed entities, they are allowed to make and enforce hall rules—for example: no players under age 16, no bringing in food or drinks from home, no sharing of Bingo packs, etc.

If halls choose to make a no-cell-phone rule, it can be enforced as well. And I think they should. For emergency reasons, however, I think the vibrate function should be permitted—for text only. People just need to have the common sense/courtesy to keep their phones in their pockets and not leave them on the gaming tables to buzz and rattle and disturb other players. —Guy

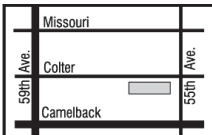

Bring a few cups of water to a boil, then pour carefully into a large heat-safe bowl. “I want to take you out for drinks or dinner to celebrate,” he said. But Kate was having none of that.

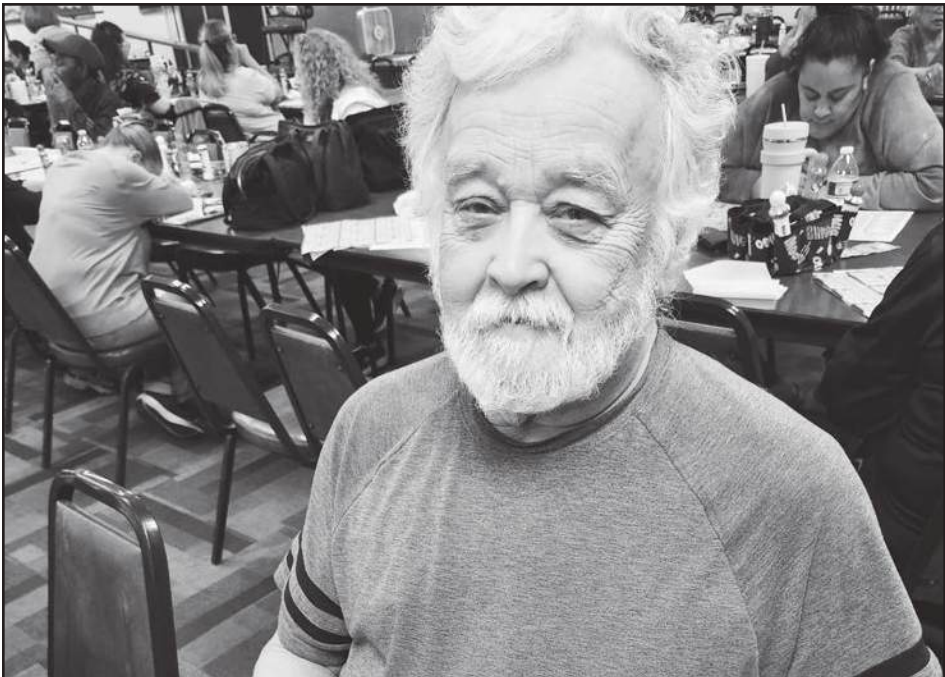
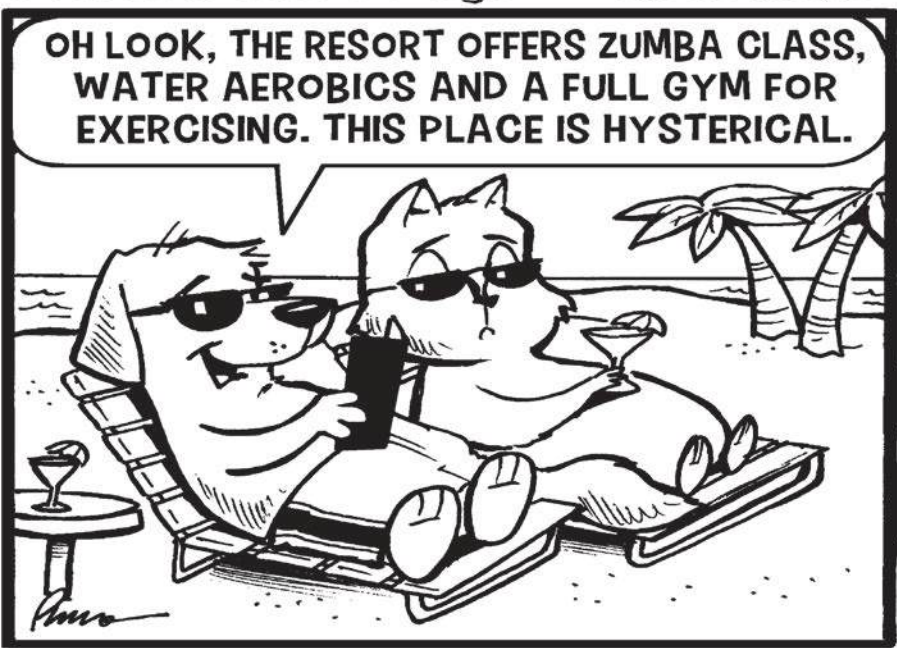
“You have provided us with enough entertainment to last a whole week. We will just take what we’ve got and be thankful. See you next time.” And with that she walked out of the building.

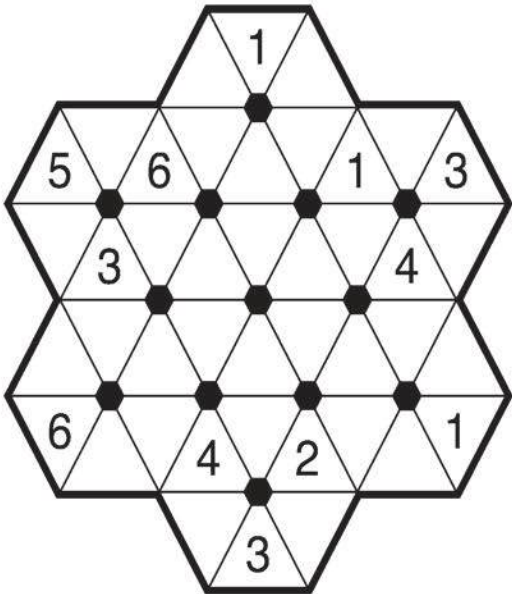

One Skillet, Endless Flavor!

One-Pot Lemon Garlic Shrimp and Rice: A Dish That’s Easy, Elegant, and Surprisingly Frugal

Shrimp, once seen as a splurge, has become a frugal choice — not because shrimp prices have dropped, but because everything else has gone up! This seafood favorite is now an economical protein compared to the skyrocketing costs of beef, chicken and even eggs. Pair that with one-pot preparation, and you’ve got dinner that’s easy on your wallet and your schedule.

One-pot recipes streamline prep, cooking and cleanup, leaving you with more time to enjoy your meal and less time spent scrubbing dishes. This dish is fast, flavorful and destined to become a weeknight favorite.

ONE POT LEMON GARLIC SHRIMP
Yield: 4-6 servings
Total Time: 30 minutes

- 16 ounces uncooked shrimp (41-60 size), thawed and peeled
- 1 fresh lemon, see note below*
- 3 tablespoons butter
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 1/2 cup red bell pepper, diced
- 2 cups long-grain white rice
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 1 1/2 cup water
- 1 teaspoon Old Bay Seasoning
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley (optional)

Prep the Ingredients: If using frozen shrimp, thaw and peel before starting.

*Zest the lemon, reserving the zest. Slice lemon in half, juice half the lemon (about 2 tablespoons juice) and slice the other half for garnish.

Saute the Garlic and Rice: Heat a deep skillet over medium heat. Add butter and garlic, and red pepper, sauteing until fragrant (1-2 minutes). Stir in the rice and con-

tinue sauteing for another 1-2 minutes until the rice begins to toast lightly. You might hear a faint crackling sound.

Add Liquid and Seasoning: Carefully pour in the chicken broth, water, lemon juice and half the lemon zest. Stir in the Old Bay and parsley. Give everything a good stir to combine.

Cook the Rice: Cover the skillet with a lid and bring the mixture to a boil over medium-high heat. Once boiling, reduce the heat to low and let it simmer for 12 minutes.

Add the Shrimp: After 12 minutes, most of the liquid should be absorbed. Lift the lid briefly to scatter the shrimp across the top of the rice. Replace the lid and continue cooking on low for 5 minutes.

Let It Rest: Without removing the lid, remove the skillet from the heat. Let it rest for an additional 5 minutes. During this time, the shrimp will finish cooking, becoming pink and opaque.

Fluff and Serve: Gently fluff the rice with a fork, mixing in the shrimp slightly. Garnish with the reserved lemon slices, lemon zest and a sprinkle of fresh parsley, if desired. Serve hot and enjoy!

To save time, use pre-minced garlic or frozen shrimp that’s already peeled.

Want to switch up the flavors? Try Italian seasoning with a sprinkle of Parmesan for a Mediterranean twist, or black pepper and grated Parmesan for a cacio e pepe-style dish.

Craving spice? A dash of Cajun seasoning, or smoked paprika adds a bold kick. For a fresh take, toss in fresh dill and a touch of crumbled feta. Love warm, aromatic flavors? Stir in a pinch of curry powder and a splash of coconut milk for a subtle, creamy depth.

Or go zesty with lime juice, cilantro and a hint of chili for a vibrant, Southwest-inspired version.

The combination of tender shrimp, fluffy rice and bold seasonings — whether it’s zesty lemon and garlic, smoky Cajun spice or a Mediterranean twist — makes this dish a winner. We hope you try your favorite variations and love it as much as we do!!
